I just wanted to thank you for your wonderful review. I got my NAPLEX score yesterday and made a 143! I know that I could not have done that without your review and all the questions sent in by past students. I really focused my study on your CD, looking up all the old test questions, and used the my Merck Manual to review a few chapters, like infectious diseases. I also passed my MPJE and got my license this week! A couple things to add about the NAPLEX. I think this was a test question, but I had a problem on how to convert Molar (Moles/volume) concentration into how many grams of the electrolyte is present in the solution. It was worded very poorly and I stared at it for ten minutes -- It was also the very first question on the test. I also got a few questions on what bug a drug does NOT treat from a list of five. Something obvious like pseudomonas was not in the list. I also had a alligation problem that wanted you to find out how much water to add to 1 ml of Bactrim to make the sulfa part a certain part per whatever. Know that premprom's generic name is. Know that with refractory hypokalemia, you need to give magnesium. Watch out for the flu vaccine (FluMist) and steroids in the patient profile. Also, I had to calculate RRR and OR on my exam. Know Avelox (can't remember spelling) generic - Interferon Beta-1A (I think). Also know that the Interferon's cause a flu like syndrome as an ADR. Know that St. John's Wort has an interaction with Cyclosporin - I did not know this and Purple Cone Flower was not a choice!

Subject: GDNA Badges

Two individuals have attempted to gain access to pharmacies in the North Metro Atlanta area using GDNA badges. But they had no credentials or identification - and they were denied access.

However, these badges are real. It appears FedEx lost a shipment of our new badges, and at this point only one has been found. The badges are gold, with the words 'Special Agent', 'Drugs and Narcotics Agency', a State of Georgia seal in the middle, and a number at the bottom - the badges were all numbered starting with '4', as in '403'.

We are requesting that you please notify your pharmacists/pharmacies that these badges are in circulation, and that individuals are attempting use them to gain entry to pharmacies. We would also request that if anyone attempts to enter a pharmacy claiming they are a GDNA agent, that the pharmacist request to see GDNA identification which will have the agent's

name and picture. If the person cannot produce identification, you are asked to, if it can be done without placing any of your pharmacists or staff in danger, immediately contact the local law enforcement authorities of the imposter in your pharmacy.
